

Professional dress for instructional and office staff members is defined as neat, clean and appropriate for the learning environment. Personal appearance should not disrupt the educational process or cause undue attention.

Clothes that fall in this category include jeans with holes; clothes that expose the midriff; clothes that expose the chest excessively; clothing that is see-through (including leggings or lounge-wear); fleece sweat pants; shower type (rubber) flip-flops; and skirts, dresses or slits shorter than mid-thigh. The District respectfully requests that employees refrain from wearing blue jeans unless it has been designated as appropriate for the work environment by the building administrator or for a special occasion. Individual schools may elect to designate “alternative dress” days as part of its regular school day dress guidelines.
